Lesson 11: The Gift of Faith



With 3 gifts, the Holy Spirit edifies the church individually and collectively.



With 3 gifts, the Holy Spirit gives us the information and guidance we need to do a specific job for the Lord.



With 3 gifts, the Holy Spirit helps us to fully preach the gospel.

The most important reason for the "power from on high" is to be a witness of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Acts 1:8

But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. Our most important work is to preach the gospel.

Mark 16:15

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. But the gospel should be FULLY preached.

Romans 15:19

Through mighty signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God; so that from Jerusalem, and round about unto Illyricum, I have fully preached the gospel of Christ.

The gospel is *fully* preached when it is presented in the power of the Spirit of God with signs and wonders following.

Signs and wonders confirm the preached word. They show that God is living and powerful, and his word is true.

The gospel is fully preached when we present both kinds of evidence.





Paul came to the Thessalonians with a gospel that was more than words.

1 Thessalonians 1:5

For our gospel came not unto you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Ghost, and in much assurance; as ye know what manner of men we were among you for your sake.



That is the purpose of the gifts of faith, the working of miracles and gifts of healings – they help us to fully preach the gospel. We will now look at the gift of faith.

By the gift of faith, the Holy Spirit helps you believe the revelation you have received from God, no matter how impossible it may seem to your own mind.



So long as we live in these mortal bodies, faith can feel like a key that we know we need but we cannot reach.



The Holy Spirit brings faith within our grasp.

Faith is not something you have to strain to reach.

It is a gift of God.

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Suddenly I stopped and said out loud, "Oh my God. It is true."




In less than a second, I was changed from an unbeliever to a believer.

This happened to me in the spring of 1977. All these years later, I have never doubted what I learned that day.




We cannot believe in what we cannot see. But it is the work of the Lord to open blind eyes!




Acts 26:18




- When Jesus came into the coasts of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, saying, Whom do men say that I the Son of man am?


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Some people believe in Jesus and other people do not. All that really matters is what YOU believe about Jesus.



Matthew 16:16-17


- ¹⁶ And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God.

Elisha gave his servant a lesson on faith that will help us all.



In this story from 2 Kings, Israel was at war with Syria. Every time the Syrians set a trap for the king of Israel, Elisha warned him about it.

How did Elisha know what the Syrians were planning, and what to tell the king of Israel to do? God gave him a word of knowledge and a word of wisdom!



2 Kings 6:8-10

- ⁸ Then the king of Syria warred against Israel, and took counsel with his servants, saying, In such and such a place *shall be* my camp.
- 9 And the man of God sent unto the king of Israel, saying, Beware that thou pass not such a place; for thither the Syrians are come down.
- ¹⁰ And the king of Israel sent to the place which the man of God told him and warned him of, and saved himself there, not once nor twice.



The king of Syria thought one of his men was telling the Israelites his plans!



2 Kings 6:11-12

- of Syria was sore troubled for this thing; and he called his servants, and said unto them, Will ye not shew me which of us is for the king of Israel?
- And one of his servants said,
 None, my lord, O king:
 but Elisha, the prophet that is in

Did Elijah's faith cause those angels to suddenly appear? NO! They were ALREADY there. His servant just could not see them.


Faith does not create.

Open thou mine eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of thy law.




It is never a question of if you have **enough** faith. The question is, do you have it or not?

 and it should obey you.






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Faith doesn't move mountains.

God opened his eyes to what was coming!




Hebrews 11:7

1 Kings 18:25-29







The LORD revealed to Elijah how this contest would end *before* Elijah challenged the prophets of Baal.

Then God gave Elijah the faith he needed to believe this revelation and carry it out.



LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, let it be known this day that thou art God in Israel, and that I am thy servant, and that I have done all these things at thy word.
