


Lesson 12: The Gift of the Working of Miracles




We know that all signs and wonders are NOT genuinely from God.




To DEFY is to break the rule, to disobey.











Miracles put the power of God on display!

Exodus 7:17 Thus saith the LORD, In this thou shalt know that I am the LORD: behold, I will smite with the rod that is in mine hand upon the waters which are in the river, and they shall be turned to blood.



The power that is needed to bring to pass a holy miracle belongs only to God. This power is NEVER given to anyone to fulfill his own desires.

Through the gifts and anointing of the Holy Spirit, a person can be used as a temporary vessel of that power according to God's will and purpose. Miracles don't happen because WE want them to happen.






The word of a King has power!

Ecclesiastes 8:4 Where the word of a king is, there is power: and who may say unto him, What doest thou?




When we speak the anointed word of the King of kings, it is just as if the King said it himself. This is what is means to speak in the name of Jesus Christ.






People think powerful ministries belong to strong and confident people, but that is almost NEVER the case.

The Bible testifies of many servants like Jeremiah who did not think they were worthy of their calling.





And Moses said unto God, Who *am* I, that I should go unto Pharaoh, and that I should bring forth the children of Israel out of Egypt?






The first time he tried to help the Jews, they said, "Who made thee a prince and a judge over us?" (Exodus 2:14).







Think about the miraculous healing of the leper, Naaman:





This little slave girl had received a revelation from the Lord.



This was the word of the Lord given to Elisha, who told it to his messenger. No matter WHO says it, it is STILL the word of the King!







And all Moses did was throw his rod to the ground, and pick it up again.







The waters of Jericho were healed when Elisha did and said what the LORD commanded him to do and say.




2 Kings 2:19-22

- ²² So the waters were healed unto this day, according to the saying of Elisha which he spake.








We looked at the first miracle done by Moses. Now we will look at the first miracle done by Jesus.




John 2:1-5



The wonder came to pass:

John 2:9-10

- ⁹ When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew;) the governor of the feast called the bridegroom,
- ¹⁰ And saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: *but* thou hast kept the good wine until now.

MOSES brought the LAW, and the law brought death.

JESUS brought GRACE AND TRUTH, and with that, the new birth.

For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.

Romans 6:23

For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Miracles are not God's way of getting us out of trouble.

Miracles are ordained to open our eyes to God's power, so we serve him "in reverence and godly fear" (Heb 12:28).

There is no such thing as a random miracle of God. Every wonder is a sign to those who see it firsthand, and to those who hear about it later.

Every miracle brings you face to face with God. One way or another, you are never the same.

The question is not, "How many miracles will you believe to see?" The question is, "How many miracles do you need to see before you believe?"

Just like Moses, we often respond to God's call with the wrong question.
